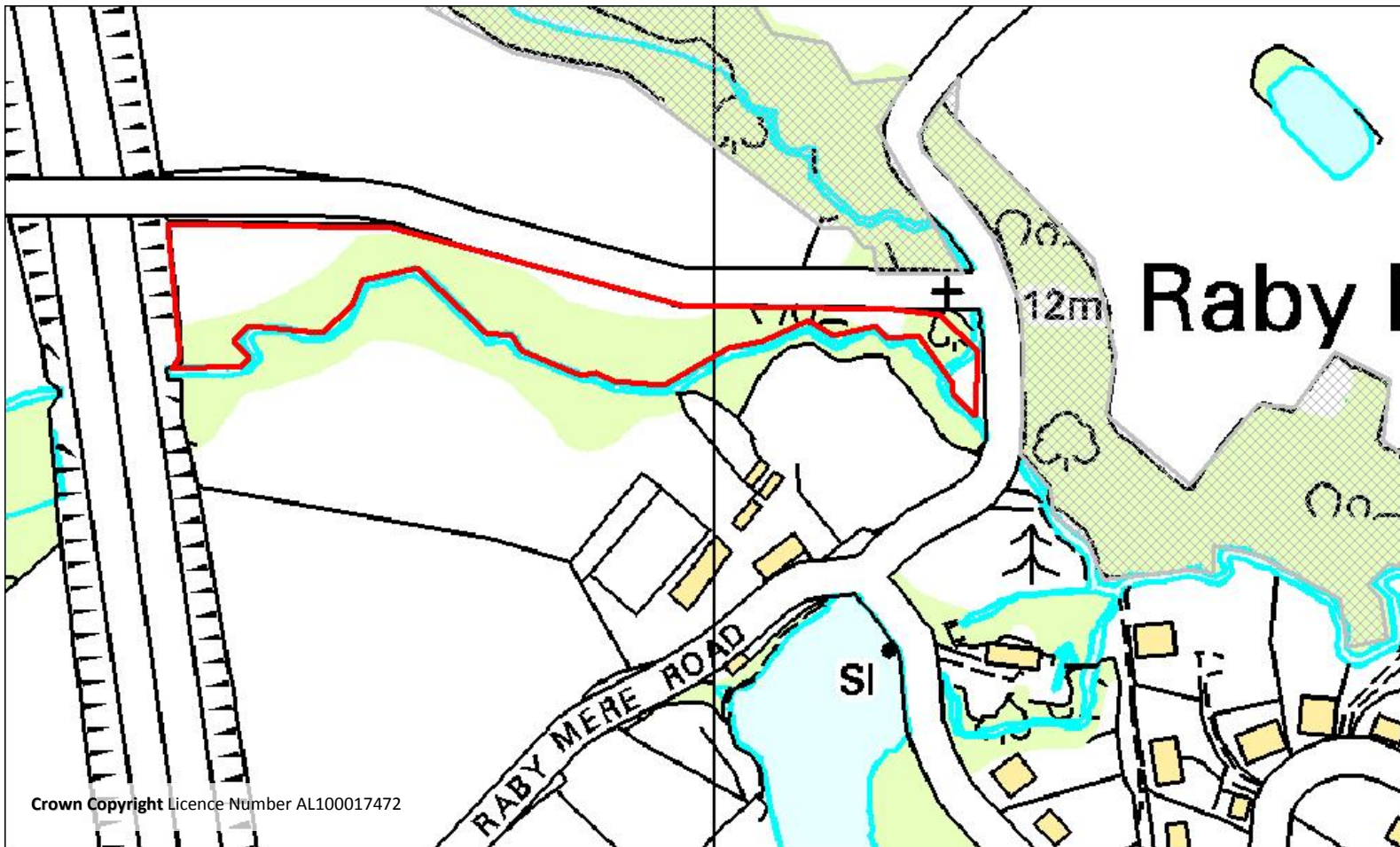


## FOXES WOOD

### Access: Have you got your permit?

Access to this site is restricted. Permits are required, these are obtainable from Cheshire Wildlife Trust; please email Jacki Hulse, Head of Estates & Land Management, on [jhulse@cheshirewt.cix.co.uk](mailto:jhulse@cheshirewt.cix.co.uk) to apply for one.

**Location:** Foxes Wood lies to the east of the M53, north west of Raby Mere, along the north bank of a tributary stream of the River Dibbin. It is close to Thornton Wood and Intake Wood which are also Cheshire Wildlife Trust nature reserves (O.S. Grid Ref.: SJ328813).



### Habitat Summary

This reserve is part of an ancient semi-natural woodland SSSI and is dominated by oak and ash. The reserve occupies 12 acres (5ha) Ground flora includes dog's mercury, bluebell, primrose and wood avens. It contains a waterfall, dry sandstone faces and an old mill-leeete which contribute to its interest.
